

History

Fukuinkan Shoten Publishers, Inc. has started its business in the year 1916 as a bookseller in Kanazawa, Japan. At first it specialized in books related to Christianity. Later on, it shifted to handling common books and started to publish exercise books for entrance examinations and pocket dictionaries for high school students. In 1952, the publishing department established itself on its own and moved its location to Tokyo. The department founded a new genre of child-care books such as "Haha no Tomo" and monthly published children's picture books such as "Kodomo no Tomo".

Ever since, we have specialized in the publications of children's books and books about children to this day.



Mission

Our underlying policy is that picture books are "not for children to read on their own but for adults to read out for them". We believe that picture books can be fully enjoyed only when repetitively read out to children bringing about enrichment to their hearts afterwards. Therefore, the picture books we deliver should be "outstanding ones created only by the greatest authors and artists of the day with their full efforts so that both children and adults could enjoy them together". We have always hoped to publish picture books and story books that are unforgettable and stay in our readers' hearts for many years to come which is an unchanged goal we aim for.

Books

One of the major characteristic of our publication is perhaps our monthly picture books which were launched back in 1956 starting with the "Kodomo no Tomo" series, and now has expanded to seven different series to cater different age groups. The masterworks of "Guri and Gura" by Rieko Nakagawa and Yuriko Yamawaki, "Her First Shopping" by Yoriko Tsutsui and Akiko Hayashi and "Everyone Poops" by Taro Gomi were all produced through this monthly picture book series.

Apart from the monthly picture books, we have introduced the "Anno's Journey" series by Mitsumasa Anno (1984 Hans Christian Andersen Award Winner for Illustration), the "Kiki's Delivery Service" series by Eiko Kadono (2018 Hans Christian Andersen Award Winner for Writing) and other works which have been endeared by children all over the world for a long period of time.

At the same time, we have been introducing masterpieces from abroad such as the "Peter Rabbit" series by Beatrix Potter, "My Father's Dragon" series by Ruth S. Gannett, the "Paddington Bear" series by Michael Bond and works by Dick Bruna.






ANIMALS BRAG ABOUT THEIR BOTTOMS

by Suzuko Momoyama commentary and supervision by Takenari Inoue


The author of this book is a professional insect artist who loves caterpillars beyond all else. And you can see that from the exquisite and delicate artwork she displays. The book introduces the full transformation of three typical butterflies we can spot anywhere in Japan. It is not easy to view all of their transformational stages if it were not for the book. You would have to observe them very patiently to actually see such changes. First a cabbage white and then a swallowtail is shown in sequence. The different colors they become according to their stages are amazing. And last comes a small pale-silver colored butterfly, curetis acuta, which does not have a common name perhaps because of its restrictive habitat range. At the end of the book, an informative commentary is added to explain the stages of transformation.



A spectacular cover invites you into this book. It is all about the great white shark, one of the most powerful hunters of the sea. Some might recognize this face from the movie "Jaws". Let's watch how it hunts. It quietly moves towards its target and dives immediately under it without being noticed. Then at full speed, it rushes toward the sea surface and gulps down its prey. Fine scales enable it to swim fast like this. There are many small holes in its face which are called the Lorenzini organ. This organ senses light current emitted from others. It has a delicate nose as well in order to detect prey from far away. Let's see how they mate and have baby sharks. Only the lucky ones manage to become adult sharks. Enjoy the dynamic illustrations.


The delicate and exquisite touches with Anno's paint brush completed the tenth and final book of this series. The traveler arrived in the Netherlands and captured the beauty of this country. The characteristic canals and windmills, the ever so famous tulips blooming in Keukenhof and the cheese markets are just some examples. Artworks of prominent painters of the Netherlands such as Johannes Vermeer and Meindert Hobbema are taken in as a motif to create the picturesque townscapes. The notes are jotted down as if they were there to be a travel diary and are quite tasteful. The original artwork was discovered from Anno's studio after he had passed away in December 2020. He had commented prior to his death that he was going to do some pieces on the Netherlands next. So he has kept his word, adding this fine piece to more than 150 other picture books he had created during his lifetime.






FRIED EGGS

by Junko Masuda



The sleeping piglet mumbles "Later...." Oh yes, it happens. When one of the children is full of energy and wants to play, others may not be in the same mood. Toddlers may read this book remembering the time when he/she couldn't get other (s) to join him/her, while babies will simply enjoy the cute illustrations and repetition. Text can be read aloud like a song, which will tickle young readers. The wood-cut-print illustrations show subtle expressions that make you smile. Enjoy the cute book of a cute story about cute piglets!








HIDE-AND-SEEK IN THE SEA




AN UNRULY LITTLE BEAR


CAUGHT A BIG FISH!

An Old Slovakian Folktale

Where does the sun live? The sun hasn't been out for three days. Let's go and wake him up! The chicks, each with a cute little bag with lunch-grains, set out to find the sun. They ask around where the sun lives, but nobody seems to know. Instead, they join the chicks and look for someone who knows where to find the sun. The growing party of chicks, a magpie, a rabbit, and a duck finally meets the hedgehog, who also joins the party and shows them the way. Can they find the sun and bring him out in the sky? A Slovakian folk tale, first translated by M. Horiuchi, published in Japanese in 1958, was revised in 1992 with new illustrations by her husband S. Horiuchi. The easy-to-read text and dynamic illustrations may seem classic but still shines bright among many other great books for children.

They actually communicate using their body color! There is also an appendix to the book showing various cuttlefish with its name.







They can wiggle their tail fins faster and more powerful than most fish. And the other fins can be stored flat opposed to their counterparts. Flat means that there would be less water resistance. Their second secret is how they grow rapidly. In ten days or so after birth, they have grown enough to feed themselves freely. They reach the top of the ocean ecology system in a short period of time.






INGENUITY TO PROTECT HOMES AROUND THE WORLD

After plenty of trials and errors, new discoveries about the earth-boring females emerge. Struggles to breed the larvae continue and lead to other hypotheses. The answers have been there within Mother Nature but not yet known and the quest carries on.









FRIENDS IN THE FIELDS
