

History

Fukuinkan Shoten Publishers, Inc. has started its business in the year 1916 as a bookseller in Kanazawa, Japan. At first it specialized in books related to Christianity. Later on, it shifted to handling common books and started to publish exercise books for entrance examinations and pocket dictionaries for high school students. In 1952, the publishing department established itself on its own and moved its location to Tokyo. The department founded a new genre of child-care books such as "Haha no Tomo" and monthly published children's picture books such as "Kodomo no Tomo".

Ever since, we have specialized in the publications of children's books and books about children to this day.



Mission

Our underlying policy is that picture books are "not for children to read on their own but for adults to read out for them". We believe that picture books can be fully enjoyed only when repetitively read out to children bringing about enrichment to their hearts afterwards. Therefore, the picture books we deliver should be "outstanding ones created only by the greatest authors and artists of the day with their full efforts so that both children and adults could enjoy them together". We have always hoped to publish picture books and story books that are unforgettable and stay in our readers' hearts for many years to come which is an unchanged goal we aim for.

Books

One of the major characteristic of our publication is perhaps our monthly picture books which were launched back in 1956 starting with the "Kodomo no Tomo" series, and now has expanded to seven different series to cater different age groups. The masterworks of "Guri and Gura" by Rieko Nakagawa and Yuriko Yamawaki, "Her First Shopping" by Yoriko Tsutsui and Akiko Hayashi and "Everyone Poops" by Taro Gomi were all produced through this monthly picture book series.

Apart from the monthly picture books, we have introduced the "Anno's Journey" series by Mitsumasa Anno (1984 Hans Christian Andersen Award Winner for Illustration), the "Kiki's Delivery Service" series by Eiko Kadono (2018 Hans Christian Andersen Award Winner for Writing) and other works which have been endeared by children all over the world for a long period of time.

At the same time, we have been introducing masterpieces from abroad such as the "Peter Rabbit" series by Beatrix Potter, "My Father's Dragon" series by Ruth S. Gannett, the "Paddington Bear" series by Michael Bond and works by Dick Bruna.










HAJIME-CHAN ON SUNDAYS

This book was published in commemoration of the 70th anniversary of Fukuinkan Shoten Publishers Inc. featuring an autobiography of Tadashi Matsui, a former president of Fukuinkan. T. Matsui was a postwar key player in building up a world for children's books in Japan. Books that children could really enjoy reading had not quite made its way yet. He believed that words/expressions children were exposed to since their early years were essential to their life further on. He constantly repeated, "Words are always with us." Matsui displays the many encounters he had with talented authors and illustrators, none of which could be ignored when talking about his career in this field. The book conveys the importance of cultivating 'words' and Matsui's deep love towards publishing children's books.





Tadashi Matsui

Born in Kyoto, Japan in 1926. Author, picture book editor, and a former president of Fukuinkan Shoten Publishers, Inc. One of the leading icon in cultivating Japanese picture book industry and published numerous children's books along with his original works. Was a member of the BIB International Jury in 1969 and 1979, and received the BIB Special Achievement Award from the Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic in 1981. Passed away in November 2022.






LITTLE PILL BUG, WHERE ARE YOU?
